# 2021 Behavioral Health Investments

Workforce Development

Allocation: \$300,000 for the following efforts and investments:

- SUDP Certification training second round \$110,000 (20 clinicians)
  - As of Aug 2021 10 enrolled to date, including 8 starting in fall quarter
- Licensure supervision support to provide organizations with master's level staff with supervision so that the staff can gain critical licensure \$150,000 (~15 organizations)
  - As of Aug 2021 funded 11 organizations so far, application still open
- Education & Training look to our providers to identify what would be most beneficial \$40,000
  - *Fall/Winter 2021 supporting at least 2 Certified Peer training sessions specifically for BHT region via Passages*

### Licensure supervision

- Licensure supervision support to provide organizations with master's level staff with supervision so that the staff can gain critical licensure
- Amount Funding <u>up to \$10,000 per applicant organization</u> to support supervision of master's level behavioral health (including SUD) staff. \$150,000 total funds available.
- **Reporting** funded partners will report on progress and funding spent on the following measures, as applicable:
  - Total hours of supervision provided (MH and SUDP)
  - How many staff were able to complete licensing hours (MH and SUDP)
  - How many staff completed training to become supervisors
  - How many billable hours were offset and at what rate
  - How much was paid in associated fees (application, testing, licenses)

BHT will use reporting to gauge funding impact & advocate for future support of regional workforce needs

## **SUDP Certification training**

- SUDP Certification training second round - \$110,000 (20 clinicians)

  - This training for advanced professionals to earn the educational requirements for Chemical Dependency Professional Certification with Alternative Training
  - Entirely online program, largely self-paced learning
- Eligibility
  - Master's level professionals (BH and MD)
