Target Goals:

MEASURING SUCCESS & SUSTAINABILITY	<p>This project will run for one year, beginning within six weeks of distribution of the grant funding. The food security project will kick off with an informational open house at Clare View Seniors to introduce the opportunity to residents. Transportation for weekly grocery store shopping and for monthly cooking classes at Second Harvest's teaching kitchen will be scheduled. 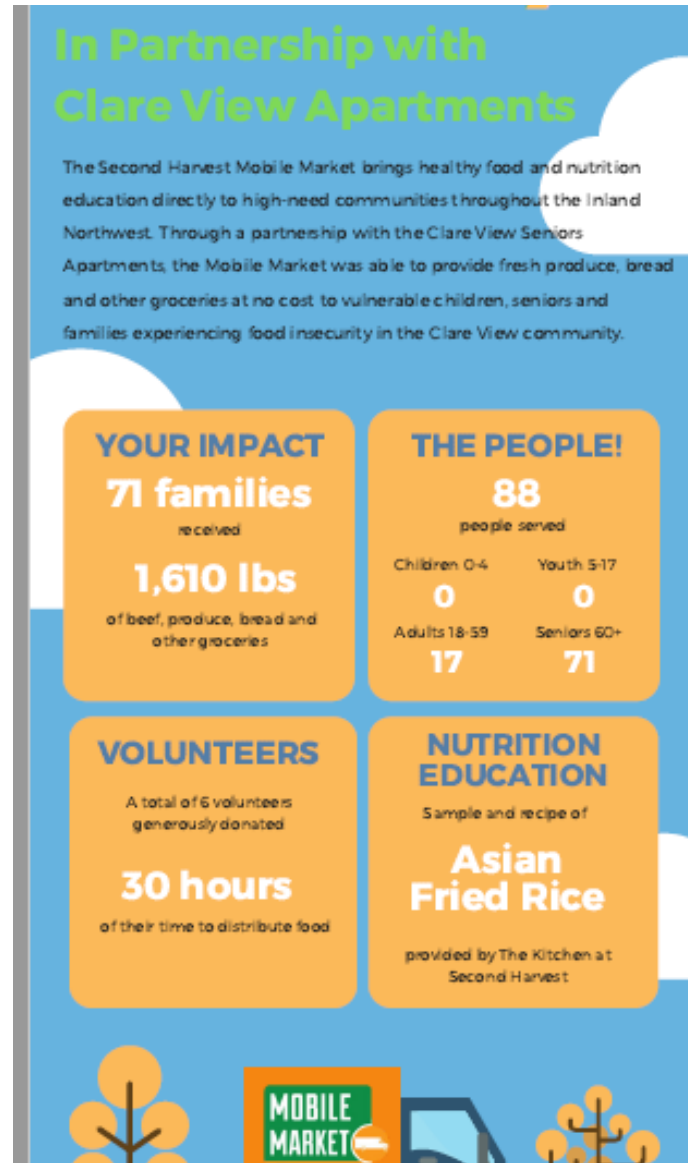

Challenges

- Communication
- Covid-19 (decrease demand)
- Higher expenses to support PPE of drivers and need to re-design program (including change of hours, transporting on one client at a time).
- Surveying group as planned is difficult – we have a new plan to propose



Successes

- PPP – lessen expenses for SNAP
- Client Success Story #1 - Betty, an elderly woman in her late 80's, used the service, on average twice a month. She requires the use of a walker for mobility assistance, has little social support, and does not drive or have another form of transportation. She used the transportation service to access the grocery store and purchase food and expressed her gratitude and the necessity of these trips every time she went.
- Client Success Story #2- Scott, an elderly gentleman in his late 70's went on every trip we had scheduled at Clare View. He uses a cane for mobility assistance and used the service to get out of his apartment and get groceries he needed. Scott stated that although he has family in the area, they are not always available to drive him to the store. He does not drive and appreciated the opportunity to get out of his apartment every week, even if just to get a cup of coffee and a newspaper from Safeway.





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
