PRIORITY-BY-PRIORITY PLANNING

- Goal: Finalize a list of activities for each gap that people agree on & can work together on
- Great work so far this year – have id’d equity gaps, resources, strategies, budgeting, activities
- In reviewing proposed activities, struck by how if we do 50 individual activities, we’re not doing collab work
 - Don’t want to spread people, dollars, energy thin
 - Proposed direction – see slides
 - This meeting – work on narrowing down list of activities, created based on themes across activities submitted by individual orgs
 - Participants agreed that this feels like the right approach
- BHT Board approved \$500,000 for Spokane Collab equity work

1. Reducing Family Violence & Trauma

- Discussion:
 - At what point do we get community input
 - Training does not equal behavioral change – needs follow-up, not one off (need to include ongoing learning/learning cohort, policy change, next steps)
 - Missing – screening to ID, refer to training. Perhaps creating community standard & linkages?
 - Where is DV/IPV?
 - ACES is intergenerational
 - In the initial identification of equity gap for Reducing Family Violence priority earlier in the year, DV/IPV was one of the areas considered. Child abuse & neglect was ultimately chosen as equity gap priority thru that process
 - Parent training – include home visit programs
 - Assessing childcare, but what are we going to do about it? Need to include recommendations and next steps
 - ACES – start community awareness
 - ROI/impact of each?
 - Anchor Community Initiative – foster housing
- Voting – following discussion, participants voted on their first, second, third choice activities
