#### **Long-Term Goal**


Decrease rates of child abuse and neglect (CAN) for ages 0-5 in the four zip codes with the highest incidence.

#### **Population Need**

Four zip codes were identified by the Family Violence Workgroup as having significantly higher rates of child abuse and neglect (CAN) compared to Spokane County. Families in these zip codes may be struggling with unequal economic and social conditions making them more susceptible to higher rates of CAN. The Family Violence Workgroup will provide trainings and resources to address these disparities by creating a more equitable and supportive environment for families that live in these zip codes.

#### **Equity Gap**

The rate of child abuse and neglect (CAN) is 1.5 to 2.8 times higher in the following four zip codes compared to the County rate (56.7): 99201, 99001, 99202, 99207.
