#### **Advocacy - Contact information provided on our website: [lcsnw.org](http://lcsnw.org)**

- Team of WA State Certified Sexual Assault and Crime Victim Advocates.
- Provide free and confidential advocacy services to victims, survivors, loved ones, and witness of traumatic events. No legal definition of a crime needs to be met. Survivor-centered/strengths based services.
- 24/7 Support Line **509.624.7273** staffed by advocates who are available to listen, support, and believe you.
- Assist with crisis intervention, safety planning, and information and referrals.
- Provide civil and criminal legal advocacy (Information regarding crime victim rights, support in reporting to law enforcement and/or CPS/APS, accompaniment to child forensic/detective/prosecutor/defense interviews, assistance with applying for protection orders and support at protection order hearings, support at trial, sentencing, and post-conviction, and assistance with College/University Title IX processes).
- Medical advocacy (Support at hospital during forensic evidence collection after a sexual assault and help in applying for Crime Victims Compensation).
- Psychoeducational support groups for survivors of sexual violence and non-offending parents/caregivers.
- Weekly outreach in the community at various locations.
- Community presentations and trainings regarding sexual violence, consent, bystander intervention, self-care/vicarious trauma, and more.

- Domestic Foster Care Program - We work collaboratively with State of Washington social workers and our certified foster parents to support state dependent youth who have complex behavioral needs. This program includes intensive case management services for youth and support for foster parents.
- Unaccompanied Refugee Minor Foster (URM) Care Program- This program places refugee youth, under the age of 18, in foster/group homes around the Spokane area. Program goals include assisting youth with the acculturation process, language acquisition, educational engagement and promotion of independent living. This program hosts monthly foster parent training and support nights as well as a monthly information night for prospective foster parents to learn about the program.
- Family Outreach Crisis Intervention Services (FOCIS) Program - The goal of FOCIS is safety and hospital diversion. FOCIS is a community based program that provides 30 days of assessment and intervention to families where the risk of youth hospitalization is imminent. FOCIS practitioners collaborate with each family's formal and informal supports to reach stabilization and ensure an appropriated level of care and support upon discharge.
- Wraparound with Intensive Services (WiSe) teams - WiSe is a community based program that equips families with skills to manage the stress and complexities of having a child with mental and behavioral health challenges while allowing them to safely remain at home and in the community. We serve youth under the age of 21 who are Medicaid eligible and have a qualifying mental health diagnosis.

#### **SAFeT Clinical - Contact our Intake Team to schedule an assessment at 747-8224**

- Outpatient mental health counseling and case management for youth and adults with a variety of mental health needs. Specialization in working with youth, trauma-focused, and refugee services for treatment. Specialization in maladaptive sexualized behaviors for youth 17 and under.
- Outpatient home/community/school based mental health counseling and case management for youth and adults with variety of mental health needs. Alternate service locations in Cheney, Cheney School District, and Deer Park.
- Certified Peer Counselors - parent peer support and refugee peer support specialists who can work individuals already participating in our counseling services.
- Therapeutic groups for youth and adults covering topics of women and sexual trauma, homicide survivors, WRAP peer support groups, social skills, nurturing parenting, and other groups as scheduled.
