Empowering Students to Succeed

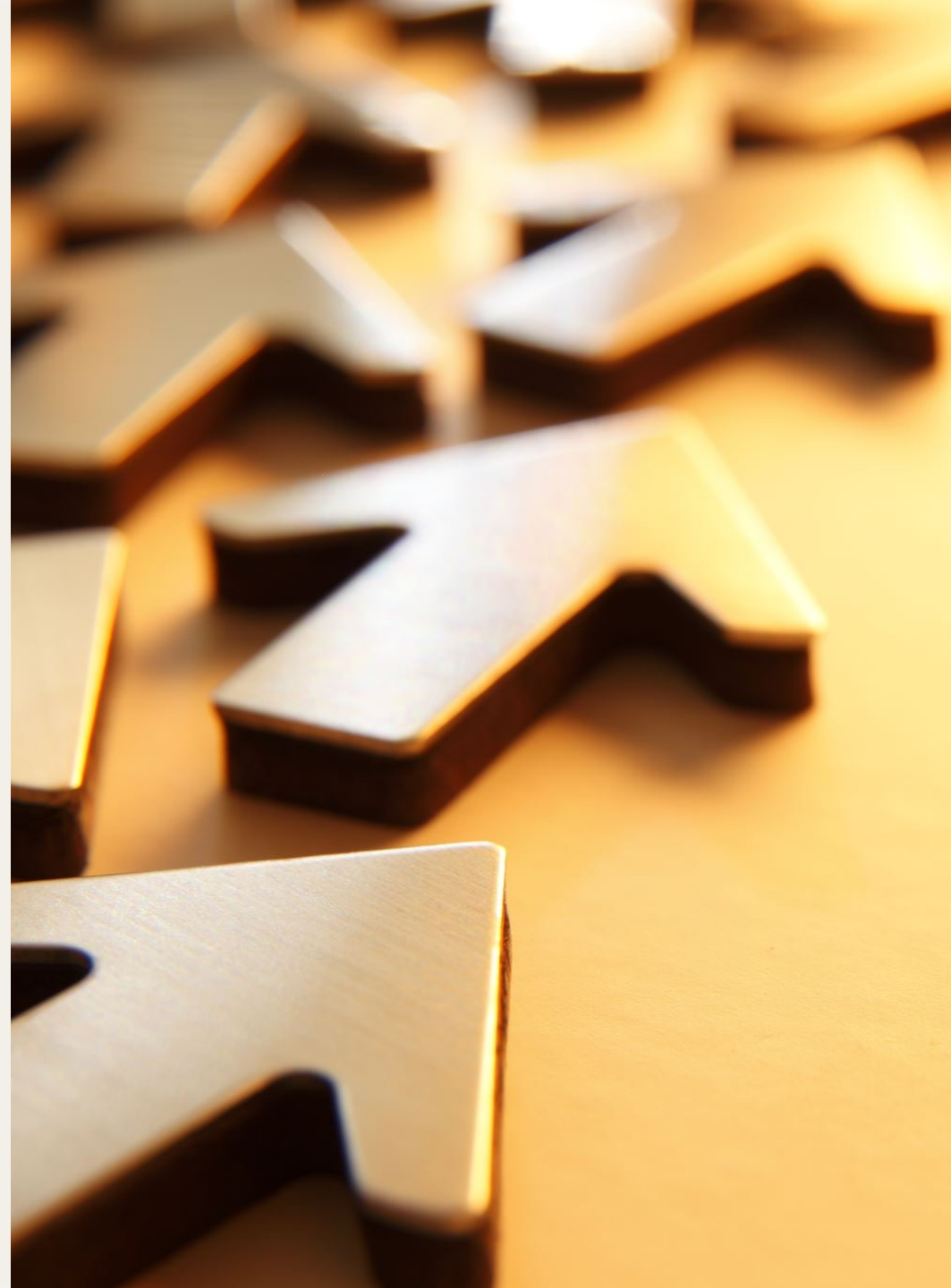
- + BHT gave \$45K to launch first BAS cohort
- + Tuition & fees for the fall quarter:
\$32,308.80
- + Second monitors: **\$1,088.90**
- + Total remaining funds: **\$11,602.30**
- + Application process





SFCC Integrated Behavioral Health-BAS 2025

- + Students have been denied funding
- + BHT serves as a bridge
- + Tuition: $\$2,714.40 \times 12 \text{ students} = \mathbf{\$32,572.80}$
- + Winter/Spring 2024; Fall, Winter, Spring 2024/25
- + **Total Ask: \$162,864.00**
